He survived the war and married We worked as a commercial traveller in provisions He died in the presence of his brother Reginald of 435 New Inn Lane He left effects of £2,954 0s 11d to his widow Marjorie Joan Howson, nee Leighton, and his father Edward Drakeford Howson. Both of his parents, his brother and sister-in-law and their son are all buried in the same grave in Trentham cemetery. His father died in 1956 aged 92. |
