The service records contain several items of correspondence relating to queries by his widow about his rank when he died. There was confusion as to whether his reported rank of Quarter Master Sergeant was valid and attracted a higher rate of widow's pension. She was finally granted a pension of 13s 9d per week from 23/6/19
