• He was 5ft 10<sup>1/2</sup> tall with blue eyes and brown hair information

• His obituary reports that he "was expected home soon after the 21<sup>st</sup> October to take up his commission".

- He was also a freemason and past master of the Gordon Lodge [2149] Hanley and was probably the youngest member to hold the post in the province. In addition he was a member of the Staffordshire Knot Chapter.
- At his death his next of kin was listed as Charles Samuel Jones JP of Milford, St Georges Rd, Rhos—on-Sea Denbighshire, late of Trentham
- In his will he left £767.10 to his mother Anne Beatrice Hubbell Jones
- He is also included on Hartshill war memorial, the Roll of Honour at Trentham Golf Club, St Giles' Book of Remembrance and Gordon Lodge, Hanley.
